Students received report cards on Friday. I know that when my children brought their report cards home, I was so proud to see areas they were successful and concerned about areas in which they scored below grade level. As a parent, I wanted to be able to help my kids improve those areas while maintaining the areas in which they were doing well.

If you see that your child has a 3 or a 4 in an area, please take the time to celebrate the effort for that achievement. Our students and teachers have worked very hard this first trimester to review last year's skills and build upon them and start learning new skills. Celebrating those grades is as important as addressing scores below a 3.

If your child has grade of 2 on the report card, he or she is nearing the grade level expectations and often additional practice at home will help bring that score up for Trimester 2. If your child has a grade of a I on the report card, this is a more serious need and one that you and the teacher may want to talk about in more detail. Please contact the teacher with any questions about how to help at home.

Also, remember that EVERY child at Hazel Dell has a Moby Max account that was purchased especially to help with home learning. For students with grades of 3 or 4, 100 minutes a week will be sufficient for review and practice. For students with grades of 1 or 2, Moby Max for 150 minutes a week is recommended.
