Principal Letter

Dear Hazel Dell Families—

We hope everyone had a nice spring break. The students have returned rested and ready to learn. We have spent some time this week reviewing school-wide expectations for recess and the classroom and common areas of the school. We had more name-calling and physical contact in March than is typical. Our goal for April, May and June is to eliminate the name calling and physical contact at recess. Please remind your child to use kind words and to report to the staff if they hear or witness anything that is not Panther Pride behavior.

This spring, we have a number of events at HD. In addition to the ones on the calendar, we have state testing using the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA). 5th grade will have one day of science testing the last week of April. Testing for reading and math in grades 3-5 will start on May 6th and continue through June 7th. Most students take a short portion of the test each day for about 2-3 weeks. The testing window allows teachers to be flexible and test in short periods of time rather than spending hours each day on tests. Please do not schedule any appointments or trips during this time without notifying the classroom teacher.

Students in grades K-2 will take the i-Ready assessment again during May but will not take the SBA tests.

Another very important event we have on May 24th is Author's Day. Every student at Hazel Dell has created a book to share with other students, staff and family members. This event will start at 1:00. Grades K, 2 and 4 read their books from 1:00-1:40 and grades 1, 3 and 5 read from 1:50-2:30. We invite you to attend this event. Students must have at least one piece of writing but can add others, if they wish.

We are excited to invite all current 4th grade students to participate in the 2019/2020 Instrumental Program.


This year-long program begins in mid-Reptember and goes until June. Vancouver School District transportation is available.

Vancouver families depend on clean rivers, streams and lakes for swimming, fishing and preserving habitat for future generations. You can help reduce one of the biggest threats to our waterways, pollution left behind from everyday activities that gets picked up by stormwater. We all contribute to stormwater pollution, so we all need to be part of the solution. Here are three easy tips you can follow to reduce

water pollution and help protect our rivers, streams and lakes. Only rain down the drain. As simple as it sounds, this is the most important principle for reducing water pollution, and it should be taken literally. Whatever goes down the storm drain almost always ends up in our streams. Even if you're not putting anything directly into a storm drain, be aware of what runoff can pick up from your home and yard. This includes grass clippings, car washing soap, fertilizers and pet waste, just to name a few. "Natural" can still be pollution. It's easy to overlook pollutants

that seem "natural," such as grass clippings, pet waste and organic fertilizers. In our developed communities, these are significant sources of pollution. Fecal coliform is one of the top pollutants found in streams, and much of it comes from pet owners who don't pick their pet's waste. Nutrients in yard debris and fertilizers feed potentially

toxic algae that deplete water of oxygen needed by aquatic life. **Sweep it up, don't hose if off.** Using a hose to wash away a spill or clean the driveway is a sure way to send pollutants to our streams. Instead, use a broom and dustpan to sweep up pollutants, close them

in a bag and put it in the garbage. For liquid spills, put down an absorbent material, such as kitty litter, and sweep it into a bag before disposing in
